1. [] the North Korean V Corps headquarters was at approximately 127-10, 39-40 (CU-3989).¹ Its 25 Mechanized Artillery Brigade headquarters was at approximately 127-26, 39-34 (CU-679795), and the 46 Division headquarters was at approximately 127-29, 40-06 (CV-6840). Arms were stored in 24 air raid shelters at approximately 127-05, 39-38 (CU-393885), and anti-aircraft machine guns were placed in the vicinity of V Corps headquarters.

Infantry Battalions of the 25 Mechanized Artillery Brigade

2. [] the 2 Infantry Battalion of the 25 Brigade was at approximately 127-27, 39-34 (CU-699742). Administrative officers included the battalion commander and deputy battalion commander, a chief of staff, a rear service deputy battalion commander, a security officer, and a battalion surgeon. Operational units under the battalion commander included independent communication and engineer platoons, three infantry companies, and a mortar company. Numbering 358 men, the battalion was equipped with 9 heavy machine guns, 27 light machine guns, 20 submachine guns, 300 rifles, 1 wireless set, 1 telephone, and 7 horse carts. The 2 Infantry Battalion was formed from the disbanded 3 Battalion² of the 507 Unit when the latter was reorganized in May 1952.

3. In June 1952 the 3 Infantry Battalion of the 25 Brigade [] was at approximately 127-51, 39-58 (DV-039260). Numbering 358 men, the

25X1 battalion was commanded by Captain CH'OE Sung-hwan (1508/0524/3562) [redacted]
 25X1 It had the same equipment as the 2 Infantry Battalion. The mission of the
 battalion was the defense of the coastal area between approximately 127-06, 40-05
 (CV-3637) and 128-05, 40-04 (DV-2332). [redacted] the 4 Infantry
 Battalion of the 25 Brigade was at approximately 127-28, 39-44 (CU-6899). Its
 strength and equipment were the same as those of the 2 Infantry Battalion.

Heavy Weapon Battalions of the 25 Mechanized Artillery Brigade

25X1 4. [redacted] the 1 Heavy Weapon Battalion of the 25 Brigade,
 numbering 465 men, was at approximately 127-31, 39-27 (CU-719655). The
 battalion was commanded by a 26-year old major. Its administrative staff
 included political, military, and rear service deputy commanders, a security
 officer, and a battalion surgeon. The battalion comprised independent
 communication and engineer platoons; a 45-mm. anti-tank company; 76-mm. and
 122-mm. artillery companies; and a heavy machine gun company. Equipment
 25X1 included 2 x 122-mm. and 3 x 76-mm. field guns, 2 x 45-mm. anti-tank guns,
 25X1 6 heavy machine guns, 9 light machine guns, 70 submachine guns, 350 rifles,
 1 wireless set, 4 horse carts, and 1 ox cart. [redacted] the battalion
 25X1 had been engaged in the construction of defense positions in the area between
 127-31, 39-28 (CU-733667) and 127-30, 39-28 (CU-715657).

5. [redacted] the 5 Heavy Weapon Battalion [redacted] was at
 25X1 approximately 127-39, 39-49 (CV-851104). The battalion was commanded by KIM
 25X1 Pak (6855/2613). Its organization, strength, and equipment were the same as
 those of the 1 heavy Weapon Battalion.

 25X1 Tonghung (127-14, 39-33) (CU-5079) and the 6 Division had possibly moved
 25X1 to the Songjin (129-12, 40-40) (EA-1701) and Ch'ongjin (129-48, 41-47)
 (EB-6626) areas [redacted]

 25X1 under the command of Senior Colonel HO Nak-ku [redacted]
 25X1 [redacted] Apparently this is not the same unit
 25X1 as the 3 Infantry Battalion, which [redacted] was
 25X1 commanded by Captain CH'OE Sung-hwan [redacted]
