THIS IS UNEVALUATED INFORMATION

1. At the Leipzig Fair in September 1952, the Russians exhibited a Soviet-made quartz glass spectrograph designated the KG 55. The instrument has very large dispersion for measurements in the ultra-violet and visible frequency ranges; it was developed by VLB Carl Zeiss, Jena, prior to 1945; the instrument was also called KG 55 by Zeiss.
2. In 1945, the Russians seized all documentary material and calculations on the instrument. Thus, despite a desire to do so, the plant cannot make the KG 55. The only technician capable of re-developing the instrument, has left Jena for Zeiss-Opton, Oberkochen, West Germany.
