- The Polish authorities in Danzig, Gdynia and Zoppot have ordered all fishing vessels operating beyond four sea miles from the Polish coast to have at least one Polish militia man on board as guard. This order was effective 1 October 1952. This new regulation will be enforced by the military.
 - SS KOSCIUSZKO, a Polish vessel, passed through the Kiel canal in a westerly direction on 17 November with a cargo of more than 10,000 tons, most of which was loaded on deck. The cargo consisted of complete heavy machinery, crane parts for factories or similar installations. She also carried a large amount of ammunition and freight cars. The cargo was destined for Red China.
