| 25X1C | 2. | On 10 August 1952, only a small number of soldiers and no weapons or equipment were observed at the barracks installations on Schiesstattring in St. Poelten (0 59/% 86). The installations were guarded by three sentries with red-bordered black epaulets who were armed with submachine gus. Sedan with an officer and a driver wearing red-bordered black epaulets was seen in front of the former Kreisgericht.¹ Two radio installations were observed about 1,500 meters west of the municipal forest; one of the installations was situated north and the other south of the road to witzendorf (0 49/% 88). The radio installation about 200 meters north of the road consisted of a small wooden building and two van-like trucks. A double telephone line from the barracks installations on Schiesstattring was strung parallel to the Austrian post lines and ended in one of the trucks. The other van-like truck was parked just east and had a wooden roof and an antenna, h or 5 meters ligh. The radio installation about 50 meters south of the road included 2 low, woode barracks buildings painted white, 2 wooden sheds containing a motor vehicle each, h tents and an antenna mast, 6 to 10 meters high, which had two mooring lines of four insulated wires each. Two small parasol-type antenna were fixed in a frame antenna on top of the antenna mast. The radio installation was surrounded by a barbed wire fence, about 1.5 meters high, and guarded by a sentry with a submachine gun.² A Soviet camp was identified at the corner of the north side of Purkerador strasse and the west side of nuchlstrasse in the eastern section of 3t.
