(Internal Use Only - CM) CONSTITUENT Dem Cowles, of the staff of Senator Mike Gravel (D., Alaska), called on behalf STAT , of Fairbanks, a U.S. citizen who claims that personal photographs that he had taken were taken away from him when he returned to the U.S. from Russia two years ago, and that he had also suffered the interception of his mail; he thinks the FBI STAT and CIA did it. further claims that he has been denied access to his files, despite FOIA requests. He now has read that a class action suit is being brought against CIA alleging invasion of privacy, and would like to join the suit. I told Cowles that the story sounded bizarre, and he agreed. I noted that CIA has no border responsibilities or internal security functions. I recommended that he contact the FBI and the Customs Service, and said I would STAT check our FOIA records to see if had made a request to CIA. I also suggested that he check with the Justice Department on any suits pending against the CIA. He said he would do so. 6.
