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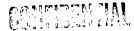

Mr. Ryan, FBI, said he believed the Community needed to take up this matter because of the increasingly broad dissemination of intelligence data. The Committee agreed to task the Investigative Standards Working Group to review this issue and report their results to the Committee.
b. Several members expressed their concern about the impact on their agencies of a recent action by the Chairman of the SIGINT Committee leading to a decision by the DCI to freeze COMINT accesses at their present level. It was noted that any future memoranda such as the one by the SIGINT Committee Chairman should be thoroughly coordinated to ensure the accuracy and currency of data.
