I advised Colonel Smith that we would like to have more on the details they desired to have covered as soon as possible. Colonel Smith said he would be glad to do this but felt this couldn't be clearly defined until the Subcommittee received State Department briefings on U.S. treaties, agreements and other commitments.

Colonel Smith advised that James Kendall and several other members of the Subcommittee staff are planning to travel to Europe in the near future to study the NATO situation. Smith said the staff would like to have a briefing this Friday or next Monday from an Agency staff member as part of their preparation for this trip. I agreed to look into this and be back in touch.
