## I. **OPERATIONS**

## Editorial/Monitorial:

With one monitor's resignation, another on extended sick leave, and one still in training, the bureau's manpower was tightly pressed to keep up with a "normal" processing load during the month. Highlighted during May were the death in an air crash of Ecuadorean President Roldos, the Father Roy Bourgeois case in El Salvador, Costa Rica's break with Cuba, and a flareup of border incidents between Nicaragua and neighboring Honduras. D. <u>Technical</u> :

Plans are well under way to add Tegucigalpa, as work has begun on extending a 4-wire telephone line to
