The Chief of Soviet military transport for Poland is General Ruzanov who has his headquarters in Warsaw. He has his own party attached to every Polish Railway District (dyreksja). These parties are known as "Z.K.U.", at the head of which stand Soviet officers with the rank of major, to whom similar parties attached to branches of "dyreksja" are subordinate. For example, the Lodz District Railways (D.O.K.P.) has four such branches: Lodz, Czentochowa, Kutno and Ostrow Wielkopolski. The heads of these parties attached to branches of D.O.K.P. are Soviet officers with the rank of captain. The task of these parties is to supervise and insure the speedy dispatch of Soviet convoys and transports, in accordance with plans.

Comment: [redacted] said that Colonel Konowalow was the Director of the Krakow Railroad District.
