1. Early in January 1949 UDB arrested 11 workmen (including three foremen) for sabotage at the "Partizan" cement factory at Solin (near Split). All those arrested (except one) were Communists.
2. It is not known whether this had anything to do with the decision of the factory's administrative board at its meeting of 20 January 1949 to "stage a demonstration of confidence" in Marshal Tito. As a result of this demonstration the factory is to work three shifts a day while the men are required to work two hours on their off-days "to produce cement necessary for the defense of the country".
