

SECRETMEMORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR
FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATIONSubject: Delegates to the International Conference on High
Frequency Broadcasting, Mexico City

1. All delegates to the International Conference on High Frequency Broadcasting from the Ukraine, Mongolia, Byelo-Russia, and the USSR have now left Mexico. A report from Mexico City, dated 20 April 1949, stated that all individuals from the countries mentioned had left for New York City via American Airlines, Flight 156, on 16 April 1949. All delegates listed were to leave from New York for Europe between 17 and 21 April 1949, with the exception of Vasili G. Marchenko, who returns to the Soviet Embassy, Washington, D.C. The names of these individuals are listed as follows:

Umitri I. Arkadiyev, Vice President of the Russian Delegation. Chief Engineer at the Ministry of Posts, Telephone, and Telegraph of the USSR in Moscow;

Aleksandr Doronin, member of the Russian delegation, also attached to the Ministry of PTT in Moscow;

Georgi Efremov, head of the delegation from Byelo-Russia. Engineer in the Ministry of PTT, Minsk;

Petr Goreshekin, secretary of the Russian delegation. Engineer at the Ministry of PTT of the USSR, in Moscow;

Vasili G. Marchenko, interpreter for the Russian delegation. Assistant attached to the Soviet Embassy, Washington, D.C.;

Oleb Mikhailovich Uspensky, head of the delegation from the Ukraine. Engineer in the General Department of the Ministry of Communications, Kiev;

Vladimir I. Siferov or Sidorov, member of the Russian delegation. Professor at the Institute of Telecommunications of Leningrad, USSR;

Sergei Nikolayevich Stoyanov, head of the Russian delegation. Chief of Section, attached to the Ministry of PTT of the USSR, Moscow.
