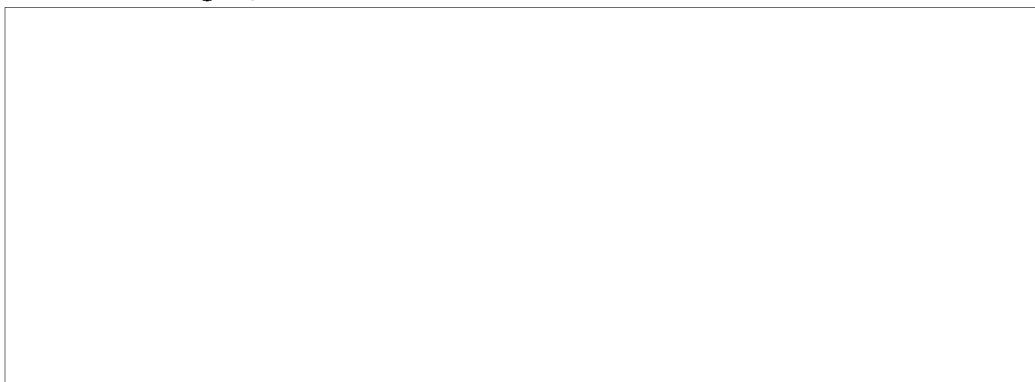

Only cigarettes in unknown quantities are produced there; at any rate, output is below that of 1948, 1949, and 1950, when 3,000,000 units a day were produced.

This decline in production has prevailed since January 1951 and no doubt is due to the drought of 1950 which affected the tobacco crop.

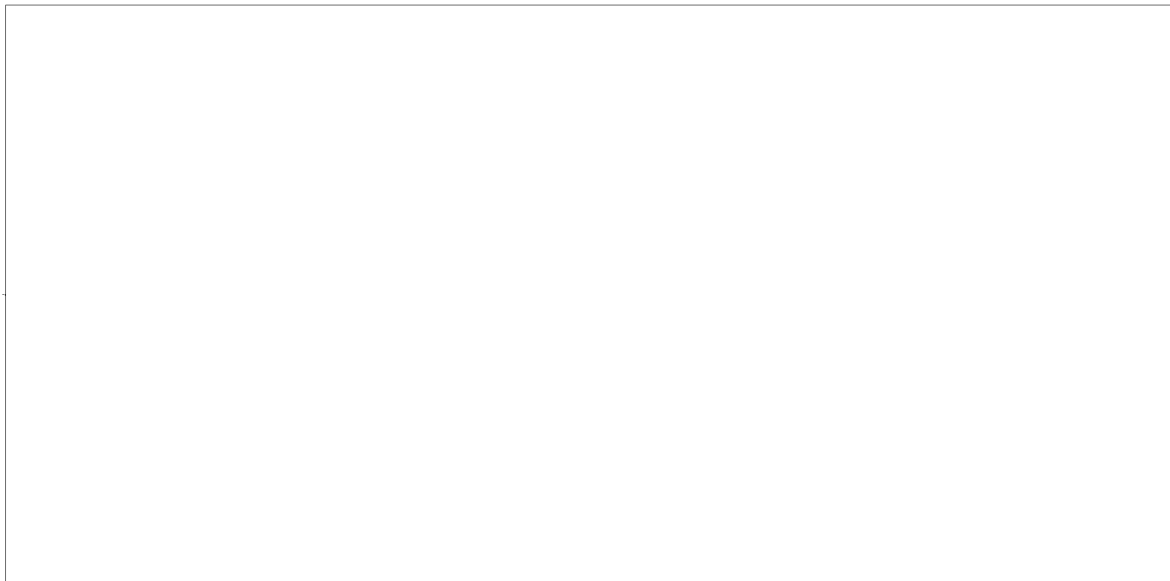
