- GROUP A. Handles territorial political affairs. Group A originally had two deputies, Jiri TAUPER, responsible for Eastern affairs, and Dr. Vavro HAJDU, responsible for Western affairs. These positions are presently vacant and Dr. Gertrude SEKANINOVA-CAKRTOVA is temporarily directing Group A. There is a Research Section for Western affairs known as A-a.
- A-I Soviet Section - Chief, Dr. Ivan KOPECKY (son of Vaclav KOPECKY, Minister of Information)
- A-II Peoples' Democracies Section - Chief, Dr. Marta GOTTVALDOVA-CEPICKOVA. This section includes China, Viet-Nam and Korea. The German Democratic Republic and Yugoslavia are separate.
- A-III Press and News Section - Chief, Richard SLANSKY (brother of Rudolf SLANSKY). The three secret Group D funds belong here and are administered by K. FOLKER.

- GROUP D. Includes the Personnel and Political Reliability Section, the Cipher, Radio communication, Passport and Courier Section and the Organizational Section. Arthur LONDON⁹ was formerly Chief of Group D. His successor has not yet been assigned but it will be one of the representatives in Parliament of the Czechoslovak Communist Party.

- There is continuous direct liaison between the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of National Security. This liaison was formerly conducted on behalf of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs by Arthur LONDON and for the Ministry of National Security by Jiri SINDELAR (offensive intelligence) and Major Kurt SMOLKA (defensive intelligence).
- Liaison is also carried on by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (i.e. formerly by LONDON) with the intelligence section of the Ministry of National Defense. The contacts in the Ministry of National Defense were Gen. Ludvig KLEN and Gen. Bedrich REICIN.
- Liaison with the Ministry of Foreign Trade was maintained by LONDON through Dr. Rudolf MARGOLIUS (who has since been succeeded, date unknown, by fnu JONAS).

- 2 [REDACTED] Comment - It was reported in October 1951 that SEDIVY had replaced CHALUPA as Chief of Protocol.

- 4 [REDACTED] Comment - It is believed that REISEL is being given a foreign post, but location unknown.

- 6 [REDACTED] Comment - One Josef HANC was Minister Plenipotentiary at the Czechoslovak Embassy in Washington, D. C. in 1948-49.
- 7 [REDACTED] Comment - Probably identical with Dr. Pavel WINKLER, former Czechoslovak Consul General in Zurich in 1949 and active in the field of international law. WINKLER practiced law for many years in Vlado CLEMENTIS' office in Bratislava.
- 8 [REDACTED] Comment - See paragraph 23 of [REDACTED] dated 23 February 1950. 25X1A
- 9 [REDACTED] Comment - LONDON was purged and imprisoned in early March 1949.
- 10 [REDACTED] Comment - Sections D-c and D-d are under the direct control of the Ministry of National Security.
- 11 [REDACTED] Comment - One Josef OUREDNICIK has been reported by an independent source as a Czechoslovak diplomatic courier to Belgium, Holland and Italy in 1949-50.
