RAW MATERIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR 1951 - 1953 PIG IRON PRODUCTION AT THE METALLURGICAL COMBINE EAST (6 pp; [redacted])

This [redacted] document deals with the raw material requirements for the 1951 - 1953 pig iron production at the Metallurgical Combine East, Fuerstenberg/Oder, and can be divided into 6 parts.

1. Ore requirements from the Braune Saupf Mine. Monthly ore requirements are given [redacted] and the 1951 total. (1951 total - 13,680 tons). 1952 ore requirements are given for every month and quarter, and for the whole year. (1952 total - 241,380 tons). 1953 ore requirements will amount to 35,840 tons monthly, or a total of 430,000 tons.
2. Ore requirements from the Schalkalden Mine. Here the same type of information is given as above. Total for the ^{7/31/51} period ending at the end of 1951, 18,200 tons; for 1952, 319,880 tons; and for 1953, 564,480 tons.
3. Ore requirements from Krivoy Rog (USSR). Here again the same type of information is given as in 1. above. Total for the ^{7/31/51} period ending at the end of 1951, 36,050 tons; for 1952, 631,120 tons; and for 1953, 1,135,680 tons.
4. Blast-furnace coke requirements. Figures are broken down in the same manner as in 1. above. Total requirements for 1951, 36,960 tons; for 1952, 649,320 tons; and for 1953, 1,169,280 tons.
5. Monthly blast-furnace coke requirements for 1951 and 1952, broken down by the quantities produced within the combine and quantities to be supplied from Poland.
6. Monthly limestone requirements, broken down in the same manner as ore requirements under 1. above. Total requirements for 1951, 26,460 tons; for 1952, 468,000 tons; and for 1953, 840,000 tons.
