mirfield Near Tukuma

- During June and July 1951 the following activities of the Seviet Air Force were observed ever the western part of Latvia.
 - It is believed that the abserved aircraft took-off from the airfield mear Tukums, but the exact location of the airfield is not known.
- 3. After dark, airwraft took-off for might training flights singly and in groups of two and three aircraft. The distance between aircraft in suck groups was thirty to fifty moters. Aircraft observed on such flights were biplanes, apparently PO-2s.
- $I_{b^{*}}$ Judging by the noise of the engines that could be heard from the airfield, training was being carried out in night landings and take-offs.
- 5. Occasionally during the night twin-engine monoplanes were observed coming from the airfield. The type of these aircraft is not known, but their speed was estimated at 350 km. per hour.
- 6. On seme days fighter aircraft took-off and landed during the day, and en escasion, this went on continuously, all day.
- 7. Fighter aircraft flew in twos and horses and practiced target shooting. The target was a cylindrical bag towed by another aircraft, and the practice included appreaching the target from above, from below, and from either side, while the aircraft towing the target was flying straight and also would it was turning.
- 8. The type of fighter aircraft observed were YAK-02 with an estimated speed of 600 km. per hour.

9. The activities observed ever this airfield took place for two to tared weeks at a time, after which there was no flying for two or three weeks, even during ideal flying weather, and then there was renewed activity for two to three weeks, which seems to suggest that there is no permanent air training school at this field but that it is used by Seviet Air Force units to complete a certain part of their training.

Airfield Mear Bogure

- During the summer of 1950, activities similar to these described above were also observed although the location of the airfield from which fighter aircraft came was not definitely known, it is believed that the aircraft which took part came from a field in the vicinity of Engure (57-09M, 23-13E). The types of aircraft observed were similar to those described in paragraph eight above.
- During June and July 1950 twim-engine menoplane bembers were also observed flying out towards the Gulf of Miga, and soon afterwards, the detenation of bembs could be heard. The bember aircraft flew at an estimated speed of 400 km. per hour. The sound of the detenations came from a sector between Magure and Mararags (57-22N, 23-07E) and it is believed that the bembs were dropped into the sea.
- 12. Occasionally, judging only from the sound as the aircraft could not be seen, larger units of bombers flow towards the Gulf of Migs, and the explesion of bombs could be neard from the direction of the Gulf.
