[redacted] noticed a considerable number of autos of various types and sizes. It is believed that the auto unit belongs to the IVth Army. On the northern, southern and eastern sides it is encircled by a wall about 3 m. high, on the western side is barbed wire about 3m. high. The area is approximately 400 x 300 m; within the barbed wire are an undetermined number of buildings used for machine shops and various stores.

In addition to the regular blockhouses along the border line (similar to those along the other borders of YUGOSLAVIA, including the Italian-Yugoslav border), other defensive works have been built along the borders since the break with the Cominform and as a result of continuous border crossings and incidents. The following defensive works are known

Entrenchments

Trenches have been dug at strategic points along the entire border strip from MONTENEGRO to GREECE. They are generally equivalent in depth to the height of a man and about 80 centimeters wide. Their length varies according to the terrain and the spaces of ground prepared for the installation of artillery in case of need. Trenches with an uninterrupted length of 3 kilometers have been noted at certain points. Normally the trenches are not manned; they are maintained and kept in order by troops of the operational units garrisoned in the zone.

Artillery emplacements

There are no permanent emplacements. However, spaces of levelled ground have been prepared to make possible the immediate installation of artillery pieces at predetermined points in case of necessity. These spaces are located at intervals of 400-500 meters.

Mine fields

Mine fields of various sizes, consisting of from 4-5 to 25-30 mines according to the position, have been sown at vital points such as

trails, roads, and passes. In most cases these are antipersonnel mines, in square wooden boxes ~~covered~~^{lined} with zinc, with a charge of one kilogram of ~~ammonium~~^{cerasite} [sic].

The mines are of two types: pressure mines (NAGAZNE MINE) and ~~connected~~^{cord} mines (MINE ZA ZICOM). The latter type are connected to one another by a cord hidden by the grass growing on the thin layer of earth which covers them.

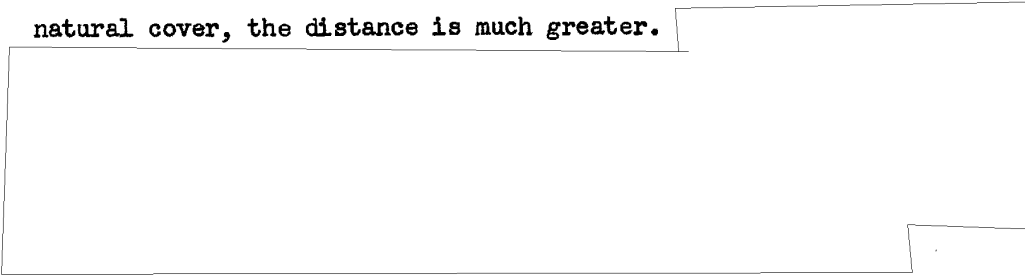
Guard duty along the line proper or rather in the immediate vicinity of the line is performed by men from the blockhouses for the respective sectors of ~~joint~~ responsibility. This service is performed by sentries

On the other hand, if the terrain is flat, without undulations or other natural cover, the distance is much greater.

Attacks of rebels on military depots

In some parts of the area of KOSMET (autonomous province of KOSOVO and METOHIJA) ~~is~~ there are still bands of rebels in the mountains, consisting of former Chetniks ~~and~~ (former partisans of General Draza MIHALLOVIC), Balisti (Albanians of KOSMET, formerly belonging to the German SS), and groups of Circassians (also formerly belonging to the German SS).  these groups of rebels come down from the mountains and make attacks especially on ~~the~~ storehouses and depots.

 the ammunition depot of the 98th Mountain Rifle ~~Regiment~~ Regiment of PRIZREN  has been attacked twice by ~~the~~ rebels.  The first attack occurred in 1948 after the break with the Cominform and the ~~consequent~~ consequent early confusion. The second attack occurred about the beginning of June 1950. On the latter occasion the sentries on guard at the depot opened fire; the other members of the guard ~~came~~ came to their aid. The shooting on both sides lasted about 10 minutes; then the band retired without leaving any victim at the scene of action. Two of the guards at the depot were killed. The attackers suffered no casualties.
