- 1. Available on loan from the CIA Library is a report, as received, from which the following information on research institutes has been extracted. The original report in addition to the information on research institutes contains information on the political situation in Poland, on the execution of the 1954 plan, on developments in the electric, paper, building and machine industry, and on transportation facilities.
- 2. The Russians seem to attach great importance to work done by the Polish research institutes, and Soviet interference in this area is far greater than in the universities and other scientific organizations.
- 3. Atomic research in Poland is concentrated in two institutes working in close connection with the Russians:
 - a. Panstwowy Instytut Telekomunikacyjny (State Institute of Telecomunications) in Warsaw, which conducts research on obtaining cadmium and boron from local raw materials. Special machinery for electronic calculations has been constructed at the institute under the guidance of Professor Turski and Lukasiewicz, a graduate student. The Institute of Sulphuric Acid of the University of Warsaw, directed by Professor Akerman, is directly attached to the State Institute of Communication and is officially listed as dealing with new methods of production of fertilizers.
 - b. Institut Elektroniki (Electronic Institute) in Warsaw which is directed by Professor Groszkowski, assisted by Professor Wesolowski. The institute is studying methods of obtaining germanium from local raw materials and the possibilities of producing uranium in vacuum furnaces.

4. Instytut Ekonomiki i Organizacji Przemyslu (Institute of Economics and Industrial Organization) in Warsaw is directed by Ilya Epstein and is connected with the Ministry of National Defense and also the State Economic Planning Commission through Mieczyslaw Lesz, one of the vice-directors of the commission.

The Institute of Economy and Industrial Organization deals with all questions concerning the labor output and the improvement of methods of control of the workers' productivity. A special section of the Pracownia Technicznego Normowania Pracy (Workshops of Technical Norms of Iabor) is attached to the Institute and is directed by Sucharek, a security officer. This section is in charge of introducing the Soviet "analytic" methods of defining output in place of the present Polish "normal" methods.
