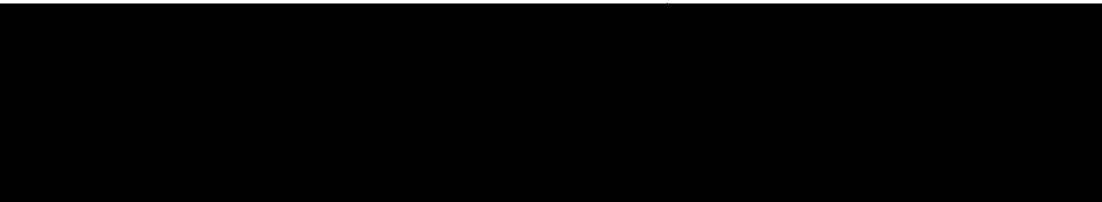

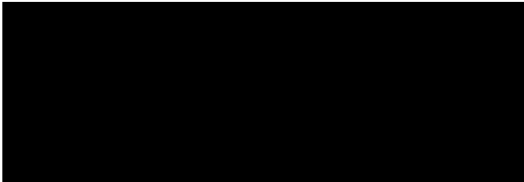

The Felipe Yupangco Sons Company, who have operated in the Philippines for many years and who own considerable wealth, anticipate the establishment of cotton spinning mills to be located near Manila. One of the Yupangco sons is in the US at present studying cotton mill operations and procedure. The company also intends to weave cloth from Remy which is grown in considerable quantities in the Island of Mindanao. A large part of the Remy production of the Philippines is sold to Japan as it is an extremely strong fiber and wears wonderfully well. The Yupangco family feel that cloth made from this material could be sold very easily in the Philippines as well as for export to adjacent countries.
