There were about two thousand people on this kolkhoz. There was a clinic for the people of the kolkhoz, with a doctor and three nurses in attendance. They said they had a flubroscope and an x-ray machine. The x-may machine was shared with another clinic. Prescriptions could be obtained at the pharmacy of the clinic free. The question of anti-biotics never came up during my visit to the kolkhoz or elsewhere during my visit to the USSR. There was no plumbing at all on the kolkhoz. Lavatories were merely authouses with a box and a hole. Flies and mosquitoes were everywhere. The facilities for washing one's hands at the kolkhoz consisted of a bowl.

2. The streets were spoilessly clean in both Moscow and Kiev. They had an excessive amount of labor engaged in keeping things clean not only in the streets, but in the hotels and office buildings. Seeing any garbage trucks. One of the reasons that they have to employ so much labor in keeping the streets of Moscow clean is that the drains on all buildings empty right on the sidewalk with the result that the sidewalks have to be constantly washed to be kept clean.
