that Pepsi Cola, owned by a brewery, is the biggest in the market by far with a 12 oz package. Canada Dry is also owned by a brewery and is the second largest. They use a 12 oz package also and sell mostly flavors and only a small mixer business. The Shangri Ia Bottling Company is third largest, selling Grapette, Mission flavors, Seven Up, and private brand spring water. They do a nice volume of business on a Cem 20 and a Cem 28 line, and are making money. Coca Cola has a fine plant and no volume. Sales last year 1954 were 65 thousand cases of Coca Cola and 50 thousand cases of seven ounce flavors. They lost US\$18 thousand in 1953 and US\$1 thousand in 1954.	
2. The wholesale price of soft drinks in Guatemala City is US\$1.04 per case, less US\$.24 tax. Bottle and case deposit is high, but it is strictly a bookkeeping arrangement, as it is credit and does not mean much.	
3. As to the manufacturing costs, sugar is US\$7.50 per 100 pounds, and CO ₂ gas is US\$.21 per pound. Bottles are imported and taxed at 3/4 of a cent per pound, plus six per cent ad valorem, plus US\$.20 per package plus six per cent on total above. Crowns cost US\$.43 per gross laid in plant. The salesman and helper receive a commission of eight and a half per cent of US\$.80 wholesale price. Plant labor gets about US\$50 per month and a bottler receives about US\$150 per month.
