have a very modern Bamberg sic/mixer mill set-up. Compared to finest in the US the mixer is not too impressive but compared to German standards it is the best. It is at least a 60-inch mill requiring two operators. All other equipment is adequate.

Water and fuel: No shortages

Power:

Firm gets power from town supply and possibly has a standby power plant. However I did not have any epportunity to examine this possibility.

Source of raw material: I do not know.

Production:

Firm does US \$75 million business per year. I have no other figures on production.

Sales:

Most sales are in European markets although currently (March 1955) the firm is selling a let of Volcolan rubber soles for Army boots to Brazil or Argentina. Firm has granted a license to a US firm for manufacture of impregnated unwoven fabric and plans to establish a US laboratory to expand use of the product. I have been asked to find a competent laboratory director but actually the firm plans to direct the laboratory's activities from Germany. The firm plans to use US materials combined with Germany's knew-how.

Employees:

About four thousand - - - average pay about US \$ .45 an hour for 48 hour week. One shift. Owners visualize employment shortage when country rearms. This is partly responsible for their desire to get modern labor-saving machines. Employees live in and around Weinheim.
