
I. GENERAL

- II. The intercom system linking Radio Control and individual monitoring booths was completed.
- III. One line counter was installed.

- IV. Monitors Kiamco and Sollberger passed the Basic Technical Knowledge Test.
- V. Cruising: 59 cruising reports were sent to 10 unscheduled speeches were intercepted; 9 news alerts were passed to editors from sources not on regular coverage; during 14 shifts, 22 areas were watched for expected important news.
- VI. Outages: Communications: incoming, two hours; outgoing, five minutes. Power: three periods of less then 10 minutes each.
