Progress Report for October 1953

ADMINISTRATION

1. The main operations building at Santa Rosa, California, was approximately 25 per cent complete at the end of October. Antenna construction approximated 60 per cent completion, and miscellaneous site work was about 40 per cent complete. Transfer of West Coast Bureau from Reseda will be effected prior to the completion of all electronic installation at Santa Rosa, because further encroachment of private housing threatens additional reception interference at Reseda. The present target date for activation at Santa Rosa is July 1954.

2. USAF officials advised informally that the Air Force is considering alternate locations [redacted] due to high costs involved in construction [redacted]. Part of this cost represents relocation of the FBIS Okinawa Bureau to [redacted]. In view of increasing uncertainty as to the necessity for relocating, Okinawa Bureau has been directed to suspend its technical planning therefor.

3. The Club-Shelter-300 structure in Okinawa is approximately 93 per cent finished. Estimated completion date is 30 November 1953.

4. Electronic installation in five new monitoring positions at the Mediterranean Bureau was completed. The additional positions will further increase the Bureau's capability for coverage of Central Asia and other critical areas. Work on modernization and standardization of the electronic installation in the main radio central room at the Mediterranean Bureau is in progress.

5. The Chief Engineer's office, FBID, in conjunction with operational facilities at the East Coast Bureau, conducted further tests of magnetic belt recording and transcribing equipment. The aim is to find the best available basic equipment on which requirements for future field monitoring equipment may be based. The high surface noise, less than ideal quality, and high cost of plastic belts for present equipment dictates that when replacements are made about two years hence, they be in magnetic belt equipment employing a re-usable recording medium.

6. After a careful review of FBID budget allotments, \$65,775 was allocated to the Office of Logistics to cover anticipated requirements for fiscal year 1954. The sum of \$27,500 was also transferred from the FBID FY 54 budget to the Foreign Documents Division budget.

7. Personnel:

a. The FBID T/O was increased by one GS-11 Intelligence Officer at the Saigon Bureau, and one GS-12 Intelligence Officer plus eleven native positions at the German Bureau, in order to provide personnel for services to DDIP components to be provided by these bureaus. The increases raise the classified ceiling of FBID from [redacted]

b. The CIA Career Service Board approved the allotment of a career development slot for [redacted] Chief East Coast Bureau, for the period ending June 1955. This is in connection with [redacted] attendance at Columbia University under Agency sponsorship.

c. One Foreign National Korean monitoring position was transferred from the Tokyo Bureau to the Okinawa Bureau in order to enable FBID better to meet requirements for monitoring of North and South Korean broadcasts.

d. Two Russian monitoring positions were added to the T/O of the Hokkaido Bureau. This is in accordance with the recommendations of the Pakistan Survey Report. Candidates for these positions were hired in Hong Kong and are presently in training in Okinawa. The Hokkaido Bureau will have a full T/O of five Russian monitors during the forthcoming winter season.

e. During October four persons entered on duty with FBID and four were terminated or transferred. The on duty figure as of the end of the month was [redacted]

OPERATIONS

8. Mr. Christopher J. Saltmarshe of the BBC Monitoring Service visited FBID Headquarters and the West Coast, Tokyo, Hokkaido, and Okinawa Bureaus during October, in accordance with agreement reached at the last FBIS-BBC Joint Coordination Committee meeting that visits of senior BBC staff members would be substituted for permanent BBC liaison officers at FBIS installations. Mr. Saltmarshe indicated particular interest in aspects

of FBID methods and organization which might provide guidance to the BBC in reviewing the efficiency of its own monitoring operation. He will visit the Saigon and Mediterranean Bureaus on his return trip to England.

9. [redacted] was transferred from Foreign Documents Division and oriented in FBID operations preparatory to his assignment to the German Bureau in connection with the establishment of press clipping and analysis services in support of German Mission requirements.

10. [redacted] FBID editor, was selected for assignment to the Saigon Bureau to conduct propaganda analysis in support of PP requirements in that area. His orientation, which will include a three-week training course with the PP Staff, and approximately two months in FBID Headquarters will be adapted to the requirements of the Radio Propaganda Branch, FBID, as well as those of the PP Staff.

11. Analysis of daytime tests and regular night schedules of the VOA megawatt transmitter in Okinawa indicates that no appreciable interference to the existing coverage of the Okinawa Bureau has resulted from the VOA transmissions. No serious interference problems are foreseen so long as directional antennae adjustments are properly maintained by VOA.

12. The Okinawa Bureau cooperated with the 20th Air Force at the latter's request in testing an MIG airplane secured through the defection of a North Korean pilot. Air Force personnel were given access to bureau facilities for the purpose of monitoring test measurement signals and maintaining air to ground communications outside the range of normal USAF operations.

13. The FBID Broadcast Information Section supplied special reports as indicated:

a. A report on broadcasting stations in the Republic of Panama for OIR, Department of State, for incorporation into Section 43 of NIS 77.

b. A report on the broadcasting system of East Germany, for ORR, CIA.

c. A report providing raw information and statistics on Soviet broadcasting and related jamming, for OIR, Department of State.

14. The Radio Propaganda Branch continued to receive desk-level requests for more thorough analysis of Satellite propaganda, most recently one from the Balkan section of the PP Staff for a regular "Trends and Highlights of Satellite Broadcasts." Earlier similar requests had come from OCI and from an OIR section. Requesters have been informed that new requirements which have been placed on the London Bureau Analysis Section, together with the entrance on departmental duty of personnel in process, will effect some improvement in Satellite analysis, and have been advised to await the outcome of these changes before pressing for activities which would require an increase in T/O.

15. Contributions to national estimates during the month included two typescript studies, on Soviet economic strategy and on Sino-Soviet relations, and two Radio Propaganda Reports, on Iran and on Chinese political and economic consolidation.

16. A report on Bulgarian broadcasting was submitted in typescript to OIR as a contribution to the "Psychological Intelligence Digest."

17. Other subjects treated in Radio Propaganda Reports were Soviet and Chinese influence in Korea, Soviet educational and cultural broadcasts, and the current Chinese National Day slogans.

18. A commendation from the Senior Representative in Tokyo was received through channels for a 29 July report on the economic objectives of the Chinese Communists.

II. LOCAL SERVICES RENDERED BY FIELD BUREAUS

East Coast Bureau

Daily distribution of the epidemiological bulletin of the World Health Organization is made to OSI and FEAF, Tokyo.

West Coast Bureau

All Peking Morse and processed voice material, Soviet Regional material and other press items dealing with Burma, Malaya and Indochina are filed to FEC and FEAF. All PANASIA and press items dealing with U.S. or Asiatic Air Forces are filed to FEAF. All Peking NCNA Morse material is sent to Ryukyus Command. Selected Peking NCNA material is sent to the Fifth Air Force.

Tokyo Bureau

All processed intercepts are sent to staff sections of FEC. Far East Air Force receives material monitored from Radio Free Japan, Peking in Korean and Japanese, Pyongyang in Japanese, and Moscow in Japanese, Korean and Mandarin. Fifth Air Force in Korea receives Pyongyang material in Japanese. Peking material in Korean and Pyongyang material in Japanese is filed to the Eighth Army and USIS, Korea. USIS, Formosa receives Peking and Chungking material in Tibetan. Selected material including Kyodo and Jiji releases and Radio Free Japan intercepts are furnished Civil Information and Education Section, U.S. Civil Administration, Ryukyus. All items monitored in Japanese are furnished the American Embassy, Tokyo.

Hokkaido Bureau

All processed intercepts are furnished Headquarters, FEC and FEAF in Tokyo, and G-2 1st Cavalry Division, Camp Crawford. Weather reports from USSR regional coverage are furnished Field Research Unit, FEC. All summaries of monitored Siberian regional and Outer Mongolian programs in Russian are supplied to G-2 1st Cavalry Division, Camp Crawford. All summaries of Ulan Bator Russian broadcasts are furnished Documents Research Section, FEC.

Okinawa Bureau

All processed intercepts are filed to Tokyo for FEC staff section. All processed items from Chinese Communist stations and Pyongyang POW broadcast material are transmitted to the Intelligence Section, FEAF. All Korean material is filed to the U.S. Embassy, Seoul. Selected items from Chinese Communist broadcasts are sent to USIS, Taipei. A limited selection of items from Pyongyang is filed to the Intelligence Sections of the Eighth Army and the Fifth Air Force. Fifth Air Force also receives political-military material processed from Peking broadcasts. Logs of Vietnam News Agency (Ho Government) and GMH (unidentified Communist station) items and texted material from Chinese Home and Regional Service broadcasts and Chinese Numeral Code transmissions are

sent to FBIS, Saigon, for local dissemination. Selected Pyongyang, Peking, Vietnam, Moscow, Indonesian, Thai, and Mongolian material is transmitted to G-2, Ryukyus Command. UN programs beamed to Korea and China are reported once a month to FEC and FEAF, Tokyo. All processed material from Siberian stations is transmitted to FEC staff sections in Tokyo.

Saigon Bureau

All processed material is filed to FEC, Tokyo and furnished the American Embassy, USIS and Army Attache in Saigon. Selected material is furnished the Foreign Operations Administration Information Division, the Military Assistance Advisory Group and the Director General of Documentation of the French High Commission in Saigon.

Mediterranean Bureau

Soviet Kurdish-language intercepts are airmailed to the American Embassies in Baghdad and Teheran. Summaries of Soviet Kurdish-language broadcasts and processed Arabic material from Iraq, Jordan, Egypt and Syria are sent to the American Embassy, Baghdad. Selected Balkan material is airmailed to the American Embassy, Athens. Processed items relating to Cyprus are sent to the Colonial Secretary and the Defense Security Officer, both in Nicosia. Processed material relating to Iran is sent to the Defense Security Officer, Nicosia.

Austrian Bureau

All processed material is filed to the Public Information Division, Headquarters, USFA, Salzburg and the Public Affairs Division, USCOA, Salzburg. The daily Austrian Press Review is supplied to the Political Division, U.S. Embassy, Vienna, and the monthly Economic Report to the Reports and Statistical Branch, U.S. Special Mission for Economic Cooperation, Vienna.

German Bureau

All processed material is filed to HICOG in Bonn-Mehlem and Frankfurt, to the 7997th Composite Group, Frankfurt Military Post. Radio Volga broadcasts are relayed to the Munich studios of the Voice of America.

London Bureau

Daily reviews of USSR, Satellite and East German broadcasts are delivered to local users in London and sent by wire to consumers in Western Europe: including G-2 EUCOM; G-2 Frankfurt; SHAPE, Paris 50X1-RIAS, Berlin; and VOA, Munich. A 33,000 word selection from Soviet and Satellite broadcasts monitored at London and the Mediterranean Bureau is transmitted daily by wire from London to Munich studios of the Voice of America and to the German Bureau for transmittal to the 7997th Composite Group, Frankfurt Military Post, and other local users.



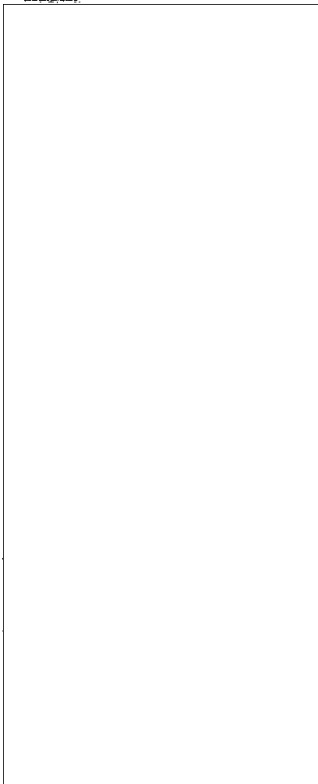

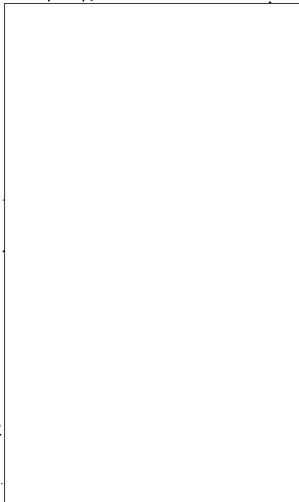
