Progress Report for May 1951

1. Coverage allocations between the BBC and the Mediterranean Bureau have been revised to minimize duplication of coverage effort. This has been accomplished in part by fixing responsibility by services among several countries, for example, Kyrenia will handle all Bulgarian Home Service; BBC will cover Bulgarian foreign services. Where split coverage of a service could not be avoided because of BBC's special requirements, FBID has reserved the right to resume coverage of individual programs allotted to BBC if Caversham is not able to supply summaries of them promptly to the Mediterranean Bureau.
2. With the return of normal radio propagation conditions in May, the intercept of the Kyrenia file at [redacted] recovered to an average level of 45% of the total Cyprus file. During the major portion of May [redacted] intercepted approximately 50% of the Kyrenia file, with peak days running over 70% and a low near 20%. It is believed that [redacted] will normally intercept 50% of the Kyrenia traffic. 50X1

3. Production of reports on broadcast indications of civil disaffection and other domestic difficulties in the USSR has been initiated under the experimental Counter Psychological Warfare project requested by O/PC. The first reports were well received in O/PC and the Department of State, and future numbers will be disseminated as [redacted] 50X1
4. It has been observed that intelligence publications in references to Communist propaganda have increasingly utilized the results of Special Reports Branch studies. Many issues of such publications as the IAC Watch Committee Report, OIR's monthly Soviet Affairs and weekly Trends in Soviet-Communist Tactics, Defense Department's Intelligence Review, CIA's Daily Digest and National Intelligence Estimates now paraphrase, quote verbatim, or incorporate in some manner the observations made by Special Reports Branch on current propaganda characteristics.
5. Prisoner of war names and messages broadcast by the Peking radio, heretofore supplied only to the Office of the Provost Marshal General, are now also filed to the Departments of the Army, Navy, Air Force, and to the U. S. Marine Corps.
6. In order to allow more Western European material to be published in the Daily Report throughout the week and to present under a single cover the entire German Economic Report, the Editorial Branch will edit and prepare for reproduction the complete report for the week on Saturday. It will be included in Monday's edition of the Western European Daily Report.

**II. Local Services Rendered by the Field:**London Bureau

Daily summaries of Western and Eastern European radio reaction to the Council of Deputy Foreign Ministers in Paris and to the major issues under discussion are made available to the American delegation attending the Conference and to SHAPE.\* This special service will continue for the duration of the Conference.

Daily summaries of USSR, Satellite and German broadcasts are delivered to local users in London and sent by teletype to consumers in Western Europe; i.e., American Embassy offices in London and Paris and The Hague; G-2, USA, Frankfurt; HICOG, Frankfurt; HICOG, Berlin; U.S. Delegation, Austrian Mission; North Atlantic Treaty Organization; SHAPE,\* etc.

All available transcripts and summaries of broadcasts of the Radio of Free Russia monitored by the BBC are transmitted to the U.S. Embassy in London.\*

Tokyo Bureau

All processed intercepts are sent to G-2, USA, FEC and the Intelligence Section, FEAF. A copy of the Korean file is transmitted to U.S. Embassy, Pusan, and G-2, Eighth Army via radioteletype.

Orinosa Bureau

All processed intercepts are filed to G-2, USA, FEC and Intelligence Section, FEAF. A copy of Peking intercepts is filed to USIS, Formosa.

West Coast Bureau

Copies of Peking intercepts and Vietnam News Agency intercepts\* are filed to G-2, USA, FEC.

East Coast Bureau

Daily distribution of an epidemiological bulletin of the World Health Organisation is made to the Office of Scientific Intelligence.

German Bureau

Copies of all processed material are sent to the Economic Branch and to the Radio and Press Branch, Office of Intelligence, HICOG.

Austrian Bureau

A daily file of selected material is furnished the Office of the Chief of Staff, USFA. The complete file of the Austrian Bureau is supplied to the Intelligence Coordination Branch, USFA, and to G-2, USFA Rear, Salzburg.

Mediterranean Bureau

Copies of all processed Soviet Kurdish-language intercepts are air mailed to American Embassy offices in Tehran and Baghdad. A Balkan roundup of significant news items is prepared and transmitted daily as a special service to the Office of Policy Coordination.

Progress Report for May 1951.

1. With the return of radio propagation conditions to normal during the month of May the intercept [redacted] recovered to an average level of 45 per cent of the total Cyprus file. Peak days ran over 70 per cent while a few bad days dropped near 20 per cent, with the majority of days yielding approximately 50 per cent. It is believed that a 50 per cent intercept will be the normal expectation.
