CIA Says Castro Exports Revolt

While Premier Castro was out in Camaguey Province felling sugar stalks with his machete, the CIA reported the Cuban leader has organized subversion for export along with sugar. The CIA statement to a House Latin American Affairs subcommittee said the Cuban General Directorate of Intelligence (DGI) in 1963 gave \$250,000 to Guatemalan revolutionaries and \$30,000 to other groups in El Salvador and Panama. The and . DGI gives complete training courses in sabotage and associated revolutionary arts, said the CIA, which learned this from a defector. Alleged Communist plots have recently been uncovered in Mexico, Brazil, Chile and Venezuela.

Cuban subversion seems to be centering on Venezuela, Guatemala and Colombia, the Central Intelligence Agency told Congress. The CIA, in a report made public yesterday by a House Foreign Affairs subcommittee, said the Fidel Castro government had developed a "highly professional espionage and subversion agency."
