Executive Order 12333 charges the Agency with responsibility for conducting human research under Health and Human Services (HHS) guidelines. The terms "research" and "human subjects" are very broadly defined under these guidelines. occasion, Agency projects have come within this purview. the Agency is not a research institution, this possibility may be inadvertently overlooked. The Agency has recognized this potential and has increased employee sensitivity to the subject of human research through incorporating the HHS guidelines into in the past year.
