Dear Senator Hart:

Thank you for your letter of 20 July 1982 enclosing correspondence you received from [redacted] requesting information pertaining to her late husband's employment with the Central Intelligence Agency.

[redacted] has been in touch with us through another Congressional sponsor and has been advised that records on file indicate that her husband performed active duty service with the United States Army from 16 January 1951 to 28 January 1953. However, during the period from 17 December 1951 to 28 January 1953, while a military officer, he was detailed to this Agency. His salary was paid by the U.S. Army. Upon release from active duty on 28 January 1953 [redacted] became a civilian employee with this Agency on 29 January 1953 and remained as an employee until his resignation on 5 October 1955. Agency records do not contain information relating to [redacted] career after 5 October 1955 and we are not aware if he performed other Federal civilian service.

Under the Civil Service Retirement law, an employee who is separated from the Federal service may apply for a refund of his retirement contributions or, if vested (five years of civilian service), may elect to leave his contributions in the retirement fund for a deferred annuity at age 62. Agency records reveal that Civil Service retirement deductions were withheld from [redacted] salary for the period 20 June 1955 to 5 October 1955. On the basis of [redacted] civilian service with the Agency, he was not vested and had no entitlement for any type of annuity benefits. [redacted] only option would be to request a refund of [redacted] retirement contributions from the Office of Personnel Management (formerly the

Civil Service Commission) if such a request had not already been made by [redacted] prior to his demise. [redacted] has been provided with the address of the Office of Personnel Management to determine if she is entitled to a refund of retirement contributions.
