Dear Mr. Casey:

The South Carolina Governor's Office, Division of Public Safety Programs, will conduct a two-day seminar on terrorism April 27 and 28, 1982 at a facility located on the military reservation at nearby Fort Jackson, South Carolina. The purpose of the seminar is to familiarize certain key state officials with the current and projected threat of terrorism, both worldwide and within the United States. This training will hopefully enable these policymakers to plan for and direct programs in their agencies to counter possible future terrorist activities. Approximately 65 persons are expected to attend the seminar.

We extend a cordial invitation to members of the Central Intelligence Agency to address the seminar on the history, organization, funding and global directions of terrorism. Paul Lunsford, Coordinator of the seminar, and a former member of the Army War College faculty, has been in contact with Mr. [redacted] from the National/Foreign Assessment Center at the agency, whom we feel would be extremely well qualified to give part of this presentation. In addition, we are aware of the excellent reputation in this field of [redacted] of your National Intelligence Council, and would be pleased to have him join in the presentation. We, of course, would welcome and be pleased to have whomever you designate.


