Dear Bill:

Herewith is an article I wrote for the American Legion, to appear this summer. I think this is the odds of The Morning Line of what's likely to happen next in Iran. I believe Iran is the payoff turf.

There is a considerable amount of British intelligence stuff on the area. General Gubbins and Colonel Ellis, who served there, gave some blood-curdling accounts of the ferocity of the action. Ellis wrote a small book on the subject - "Trans-Caspian Episode," which certainly tends to prove the area is the "soft under-belly" of Russia.
