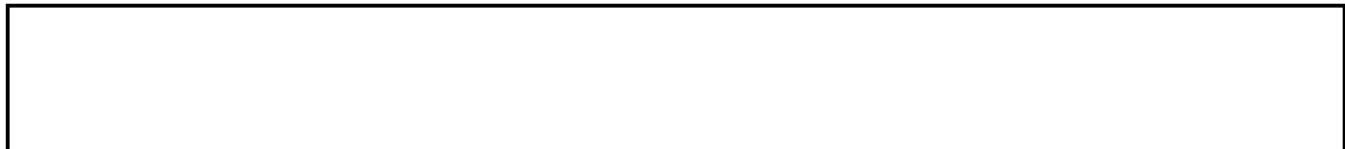
- OTE will forward a report on 11 August on the Agency's language capabilities and shortfalls over the next five years.

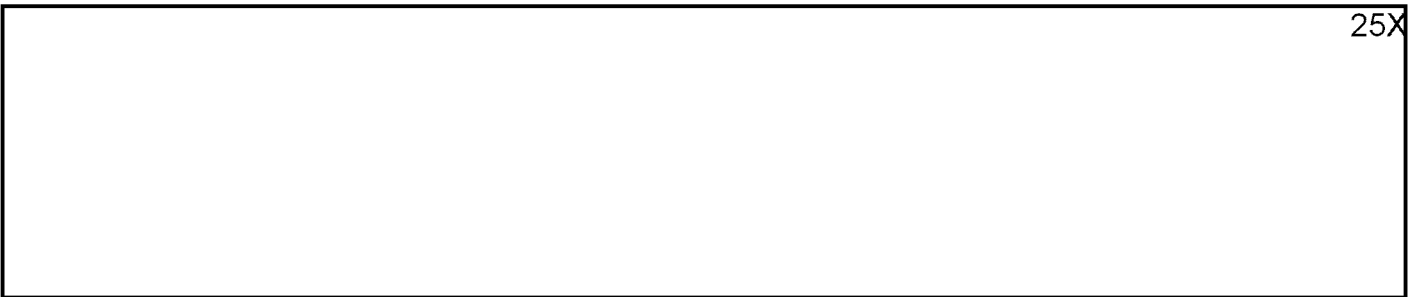

- C/NIC met with Deputy Secretary of Defense Carlucci on 9 August to discuss developments concerning the Soviet gas pipeline issue.
- NIO/GPF briefed Gen. Meyer, Army Chief of Staff, on the GPF intelligence production program. Gen. Meyer expressed particular interest in increasing efforts to provide intelligence to support the Army R&D program and budget decisions. He mentioned the need for more definitive information on Soviet tactical lasers, electronic warfare developments, and chemical, biological, and nuclear weapons.
- C/NIC hosted a briefing session involving NIC and DDI officers and Deputy Secretary of State Kenneth Dam on 12 August. The discussions centered on the Soviet economy, Soviet energy prospects, and arms control issues.
