Intelligence Community Staff

- The Director, SIGINT Collection Office, chaired a meeting of representatives from NSA and the DCI's Office of General Counsel to discuss NSA support to narcotics law enforcement. There is a substantial difference of opinion between the NSA and DCI General Counsels on some aspects of the National SIGINT Requirements List requirements. They will pursue the legality question.

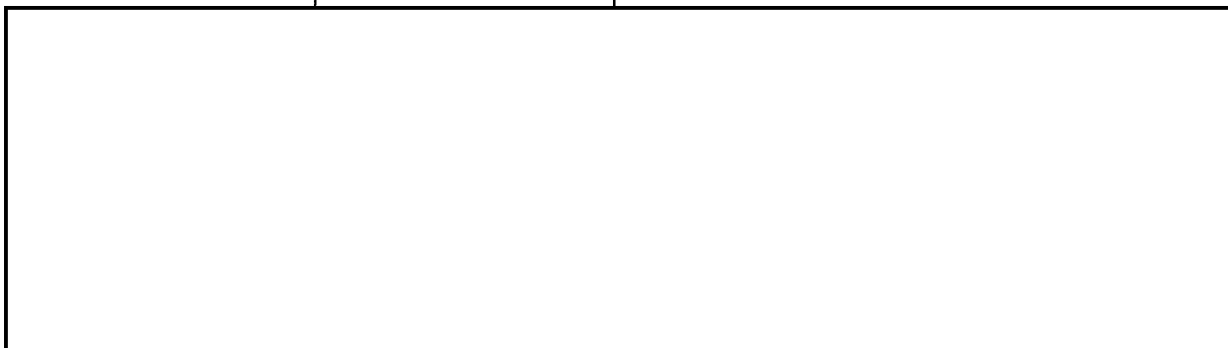

- Strategic Planning - The second meeting of the Strategic Planning Working Group was held 9 December. Major topics of discussion were the role of the Intelligence Producers Council in developing Community substantive intelligence issues; the nature, thrust, and scope of the update to the 1985 Intelligence Capabilities Study; the wartime responsibilities of the DCI and various elements of the Community; and the long-range planning programs of the various Program Managers. In early January, the Working Group is scheduled to hear presentations on long-range planning efforts by representatives of CIA, NSA, Air Force and Defense, as well as COMIREX and the SIGINT Committee.

- Narcotics - The Director, SIGINT Collection Office, chaired a meeting of reps from NSA G Group, NSA General Counsel, and the DCI General Counsel to discuss the NSA plan on how they propose to attack the narcotics problem from a SIGINT collection and reporting standpoint, and the legal concerns of NSA regarding SIGINT support to law enforcement. There is a substantial difference of opinion between the NSA and DCI General Counsels on some aspects of the NSRL requirements. They will pursue the legality question.
