- Chairman, NIC attended sessions of Fred Ikle's Defense Policy Board, which included an interesting discussion of problems in DoD's management of technological transfer.
- A/NIO/AL briefed Senator Mathias and Arch Roberts (HFAC staffer) on the Pakistani nuclear program. Senator Mathias asked for periodic followup briefings on the subject.
