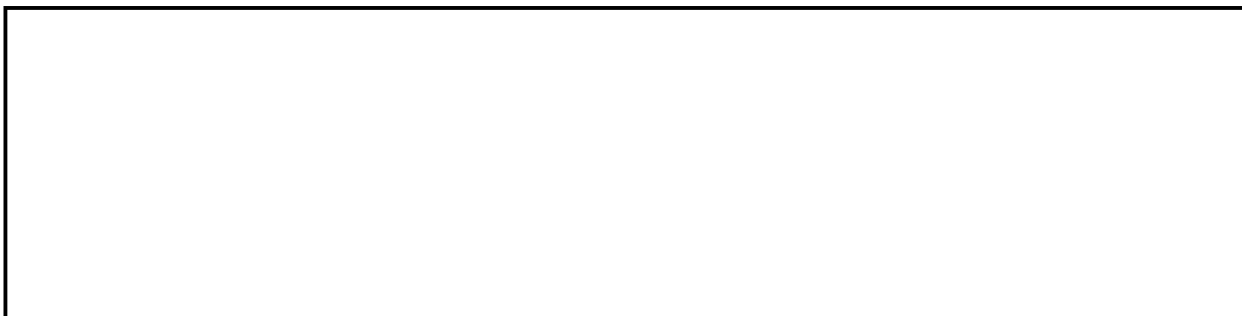
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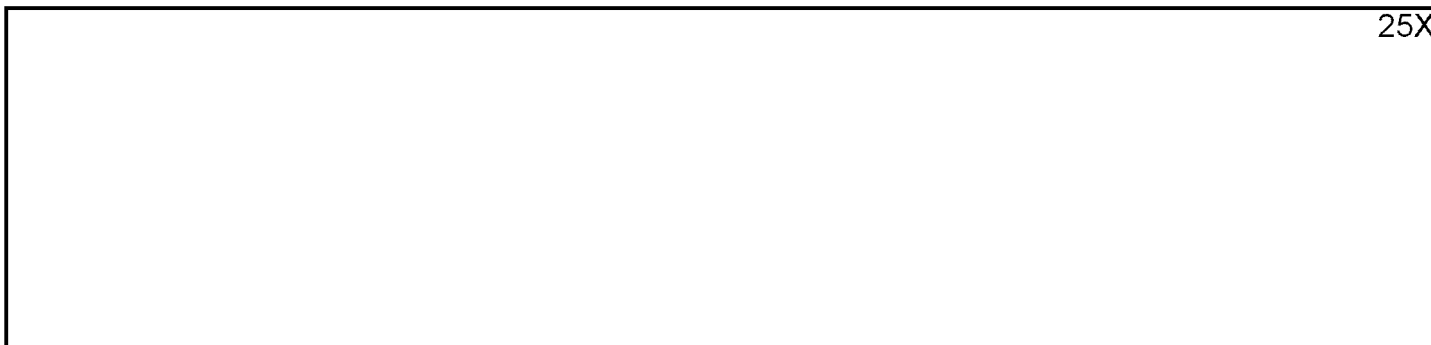
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Deputy Director for Intelligence

- At the request of the DCI, OGI briefed Kenneth R. Giddens, consultant to the Department of State for radio broadcasting to Cuba, on Cuban reaction to Radio Marti.
- ALA conducted a two-day seminar on Mexico under de la Madrid. Specialists from business, academia, and Government presented their views.
- OSWR briefed the Commander-in-Chief, SAC, on future Soviet weapons systems and potential Soviet responses to MX closely-spaced basing.
- OSWR will brief the IG on Soviet testing that may be necessary to enhance capabilities against MX closely-spaced basing.

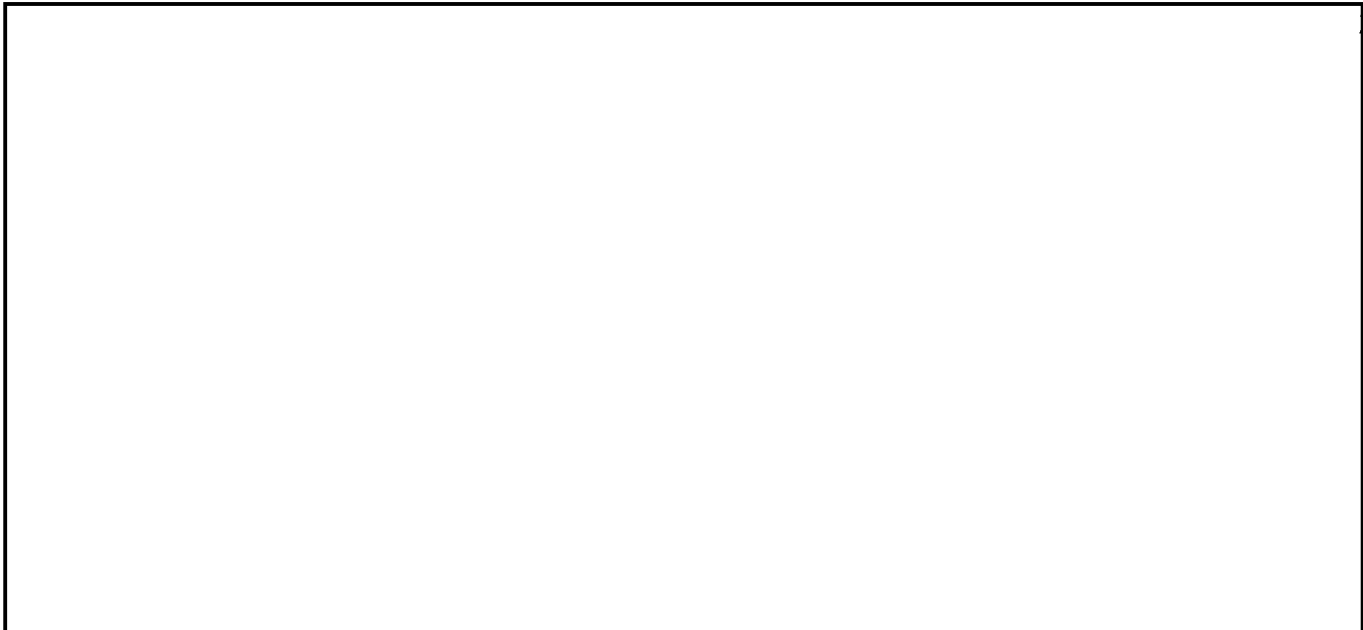

- 1. Progress reports on tasks assigned by DCI/DDCI:

- 2. Items/events of major interest:

a. The upgrading of interview rooms in the main reception area of the Headquarters building was completed on 8 November. The project consisted of lowering ceilings and lights, painting walls and ceilings, and refurbishing with brighter colored chairs.

b. In order to update surveys of the Headquarters compound and satellite locations, the Printing and Photography Division (P&PD), Office of Logistics, arranged for the Air Force to take aerial photography of the areas from a helicopter on 9 November. The Air Force provided the service at no charge, and P&PD developed the film (both still and motion picture).
