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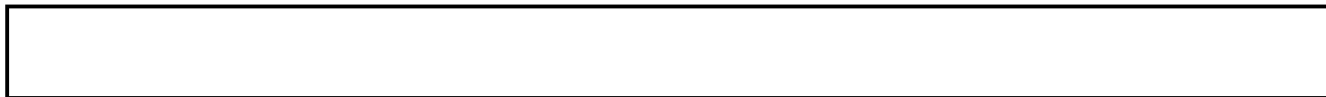


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Inspector General

i. [redacted] Chief of the Registrar Branch, Office of Medical Services, in his capacity as President of the Virginia State Society of American Medical Technologists, was the commencement speaker at the graduation exercises of Georgetown University's School of Science and Arts, on 24 October. The graduating class consisted of 55 Medical Technologists.

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j. During FY-1982, the Agency's Board of Review adjudicated 14 cases involving shortages/overages totaling approximately \$11,000. (In comparison, 35 cases were adjudicated in FY-1981 involving about \$24,000.)

k. The Classification Review Division, Office of Information Services, has completed its second review of [redacted] manuscript, The Third Vietnamese War and approved same. The book covers the same time frame and locale as Snepp's Decent Interval. The revised version of the [redacted] manuscript deleted or changed several portions to which we previously objected--this release should disprove Snepp's contention that the Agency would never release material which is critical of U.S. policy.

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3. Significant activities anticipated during the coming week:

The Office of Security Conference of Special Agents [redacted] will be held during 31 October - 5 November at Headquarters. The Deputy Director for Administration will address the conference on 4 November and Mr. Edward J. O'Mally, Assistant Director, Federal Bureau of Investigations, Intelligence Division, is also scheduled to address the group.
