

SUBJECT : Proposed Narcotics Warning Agenda

The first monthly warning meeting on Narcotics will be held on 27 September at 1400 hours in Room 7 E 62. There will be an address by John McMahon, the Deputy Director of the CIA. The following additional items will be addressed in the meeting.

I. Warning -- The Vice President's staff (Hughes) will describe the need for intelligence support to [redacted] the South Florida Task Force. 25X1

II. Regional Developments

a. CIA [redacted] will lead a discussion on the expansion of cocaine production in Latin America. 25X1

b. IC Staff [redacted] will report on the long term narcotics intelligence plan currently under preparation. 25X1

c. DEA [redacted] will explain how strategic narcotics intelligence is used by enforcement agencies. 25X1

d. NSA [redacted] will describe NSA's response to new narcotics requirements. 25X1

e. CIA [redacted] will discuss the collection of intelligence on financial flows. 25X1

III. Plans for Interagency Work -- We will try to reach agreement on a suitable topic for a national estimate. Possibilities are world cocaine production in 1982, prospects for heroin production in the Golden Triangle, or host government involvement in narcotics trafficking in Latin America.


IV. Regional Policy Issues -- Policy positions reached at the [redacted] narcotics conference will be described. 25X1

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V. Collection Implications -- Intelligence collection gaps identified in any of the subjects listed above will be recorded and their remedy assigned to appropriate collectors.
