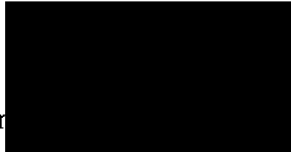

1. NPIC recommends [redacted] as the CIA nominee for the Roger W. Jones Award for Executive Leadership.

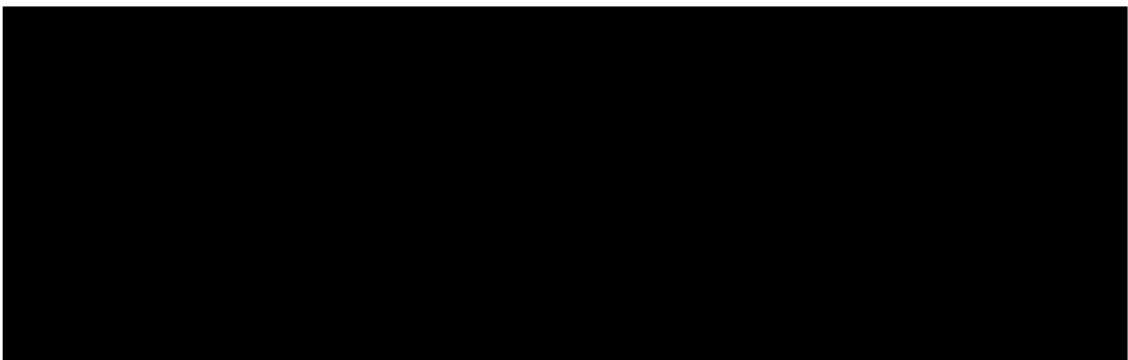
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2. [redacted] will make an exceptionally strong candidate for this award which is granted annually by American University to federal career executives who have demonstrated:



The Roger W. Jones Award for Executive Leadership

Assuring first-rate leadership by career executives in the Federal government is a high priority issue requiring constant attention. The decision arena for career executives includes complexity, conflicting forces, options, and opportunities to contribute to the national purpose which will be intensified in the Senior Executive Service. One legacy which these senior career executives can leave, however, is a cadre of outstanding managers and senior specialists committed to their own professional growth and development in order to better serve the public interest. Presidential and other administration appointees are uniquely positioned to encourage and evaluate such action by senior career executives.

In furtherance of this compelling purpose, and because of its interest in public affairs, The American University will annually grant the Roger W. Jones Award for Outstanding Executive Leadership to two career executives of the Federal government.

Criteria. The recipients of these unique awards will be selected from among those Federal career executives who have demonstrated:

- superior leadership which resulted in outstanding organizational achievements, and
- a strong commitment to the effective continuity of government by successfully bringing about the development of managers and executives.

Selection of these honor awards will be by a distinguished panel.

The **award**, a bronze plaque and citation, is presented annually at The American University's Spring Honors Convocation.

Roger W. Jones

Roger W. Jones, for whom this award is named, epitomizes the best among career executives. This exceptional public servant, in both top career and Presidential appointments, greatly influenced the establishment of a climate and structure for improved government operations through the education and training of managers and executives.

In the old Budget Bureau, the Munitions Assignment Board of World War II, the Civil Service Commission, the State Department, the Office of Management and Budget, and as a consultant to successive administrations of both parties and advisor to four Presidents, he demonstrated an extraordinary capability for excellence and service. For his exceptional contributions to the Nation, Mr. Jones has received national recognition, including the President's Award for Distinguished Federal Civilian Service, the Stockberger Award, and the National Civil Service League Award.

The Nomination Procedure

Presidential appointees and other administration appointees are invited to submit nominations of career executives responsible to them who have demonstrated outstanding executive leadership.

Each nomination shall contain the following information:

- a brief biographical sketch, including employment background;
- a description of the nominee's superior leadership which resulted in outstanding organizational achievement. This description should make clear the nature and significance of the organizational achievement and the career executive's specific role;
- a description of the nominee's strong commitment to effective continuity of government evidenced by success in bringing about the development of managers and executives. This description should include information about specific actions taken by the nominee and the results obtained; and
- a cover letter from the Head of the Agency, or other appropriate Administration appointee recommending the nominee for the award.
