1. A basic memorandum of 11 January 1950 from the Chief, Finance Division, SSS, presents what at best appears to be an unfortunate situation. The employee, overseas with his family, is being returned to this country for medical treatment two months prior to expiration of the service required for home leave. Transportation of his dependents can be reimbursed only if a PCS is involved, or if the employee is returned to the United States for home leave or termination. Since he is being returned for illness, it is for the convenience of the employee, and it would not be proper to issue a nominal PCS order from overseas to Washington. He has not yet met the requirements of two years' continuous service abroad to entitle him to home leave, yet to terminate him solely because of illness would seem to be grossly inequitable to the employee.
