Emergency Aid for Dependents of Employees Stationed Abroad.

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1. This is in answer to your memorandum of 3 May 1950, regarding the propriety of a claim for the travel expenses incurred by an employee's dependents as the result of illness. The specific case is that of [redacted] son who returned to this country, together with his mother, when he contracted polio in [redacted]

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2. We agree with your conclusion that - aside from the case of disturbed local conditions - there is no provision in pertinent laws or regulations for payment of travel expenses of dependents where the travel results from the illness of such dependents and is not related to any official transfer or change of station of the employee. It appears to fall well within the category of situations which are considered to be "for the convenience of the employee." [redacted]
