1. Your nominations for the public service awards, listed above, are requested. 3. It is requested that you screen potential candidates in your area for each of the awards, listed above, and submit to me the names of your nominees on or before 1 August.

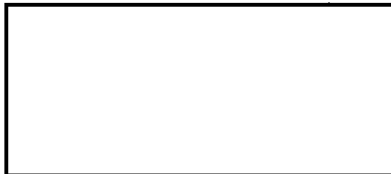

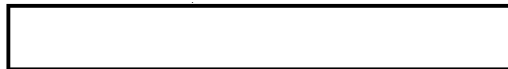


