Silver reported current work on the mini-charter has reduced its size from some 170 pages to 100 pages, but at this point he said the product is a non-starter. Relatedly, he noted the matter of publications review by CIA is becoming a nightmare with no simple solutions in sight. Hetu commented that of 33 manuscripts received for review thus far this year, 17 are from former DDO'ers. Mr. Carlucci noted the agreement by State resulted in large measure from his discussions with Under Secretary Newsom who took a particular interest in the problem. Dirks reported NPIC has turned over to GSA its "494" computer, a major computer whose lifetime ended at 13 years having responded to functions numbering into the trillions.
