The first has it that Mr. Andrompov, as previous head of the KGB, has a better grasph of Soviet economic data, Soviet societal problems and US strengths and weaknesses than any other Soviet leader. Being exposed to the West over the years has moderated his viewpoint it is alleged under this theory. Some go as far as to say that he is a closet liberal.

The second theory is that Mr. Andropov has manipulated the western press and opinion leaders by spreading theory and and really is no more than an extremely ruthless KGB chieftain who put dewn the Bugaramian rebellion in 1956 and has imprisioned tenss of thousands of dissidents.

What is your assessment of both theories?

- 10. Would acess to Western modern drilling techology for gas and oil greatly enhance Soviet production levels.
- 11. Is there any evaluence that Soviet oil and gas production limitations have reforceded their interest on the Middle East as an economic objective of Soviet foreign palicy.
- 12. Since last years testimony what can you tell us about the changes in quantity and quality of Soviet consumer products?
- 13. Given the problem the USSR has with its emerging minority populations, can you identify any specific economic planning designed to meet these problems such as:
 - a) location of defense facilities
 - b) locating factories for unemproyment purposes
 - c) stressing non defense industries in areas where there might be local unrest or large non Russian hopulations.
