

**DISPOSITION OF LIBYAN FORCES IN CHAD  
AND SOUTHERN LIBYA (SWN)**

1. **SIGNIFICANCE:** LIBYAN AND LIBYAN-BACKED DISSIDENT FORCES REMAINED DEPLOYED IN KEY LOCATIONS IN NORTHERN CHAD AND CONTINUED TO BE SUPPORTED FROM BASES IN SOUTHERN LIBYA. LIBYAN GROUND FORCE DEPLOYMENTS AT FADA, FAYA LARGEAU, OUNIANGA KEBIR, AND GOURO IN NORTHERN CHAD AND SEBHA AND KUFRA IN SOUTHERN LIBYA EACH CONTAIN AN INTEGRATED FORCE OF ARMOR AND MECHANIZED UNITS ORGANIZED INTO COMBINED ARMS FORCES. THE DISPOSITION OF THESE FORCES THROUGH \_\_\_\_\_ IS DEPICTED ON THIS GRAPHIC. (SWN)

2. **REMARKS:** GROUND FORCE ACTIVITY WAS HIGHLIGHTED BY THE DEPLOYMENT OF A MECHANIZED INFANTRY UNIT FROM KUFRA TO THE MATAN AS SARRA AREA. (SWN)

LIBYAN COMBAT AIRCRAFT OBSERVED AT AIRFIELDS IN NORTHERN CHAD DURING THE WEEK INCLUDED THREE MIRAGE F-1 FIGHTER/BOMBERS, 13 FITTER (SU-22) FIGHTER/BOMBERS (TWO PARTIALLY DISMANTLED), 16 SF.260 LIGHT-STRIKE AIRCRAFT, AND FOUR HIND ATTACK HELICOPTERS.
