Mr. Dranan introduced the following bill; which was referred jointly to the Committees on Government Operations and Small Business

ABILL

To amend the Office of Federal Procurement Policy Act to require the payment of interest by Federal agencies on overdue payments to small business concerns.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That this Act may be cited as the "Small Business Con-
- 4 tracting Equity Act".
- 5 SEC. 2. Section 6 (d) of the Office of Federal Procure-
- 6 ment Policy Act is amended—
- 7 (1) by striking out the period at the end of para-
- 8 graph (6) and inserting in lieu thereof a semicolon;

(2) by inserting immediately after such paragraph the following new paragraph:

"(7) promulgating, not later than 90 days after the date of enactment of this paragraph, regulations requiring, with respect to any contract with a small business concern, as that term is defined by the Small Business Administration pursuant to section 3 of the Small Business Act, the payment of interest upon the amount due for the period from the date on which such payment is due to the date on which such payment is made, including any period of litigation or dispute concerning such payment. Such interest is to be applied at a quarterly rate equal to one quarter of the weighted average annual rate of interest on short-term commercial and industrial loans of less than \$100,000 made by banking institutions during the calendar quarter preceding each quarter during which payment is past due, as determined by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve for general statistical purposes, except that such interest shall not accrue if the amount due is paid within 30 days of the date on which it is due.".
