1958

AD/CR (Borel) suggested to senior management possibilities (beyond PI support) of ADP: resultant DD/S study agreed. SA/AD/CR [ ] sent to California for 18 months to learn about ADP.

Oct 59-Jul 61

Upon [ ] return, a DD/I Automation Staff was established, with Joe reporting directly to Bob Amory. In October 1960, an RCA 501 was installed by the Comptroller--no connection with [ ] at that time. The DDI/AS was to plan a DDI-wide computing effort--including what is now CHIVE; [ ]

Jul 61-Aug 63

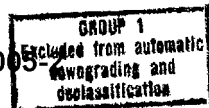
DDI/AS merged with CIA Management Staff [ ] and supplemented by [ ] to form the CIA Automatic Data Processing Staff (ADPS), organizationally placed under the DD/S. Staff charged with (1) establishing a computer center (IBM 1410/1401); (2) carrying on CHIVE and implementing "special project" applications; (3) technical supervision of DDS/Comptroller /ADP Division; (4) CIA EDP liaison.

In May 1963, on crash basis, an IBM 7090 was brought in to provide better support to Agency scientific data processing requirements and, in July, [ ] were authorized-- [ ]

Aug 63-Present

Effective 5 August, the ADPS was renamed the Office of Computer Services (OCS), with Becker as its head, and was transferred from the DD/S to the DD/S&T. Four months later (Nov 63), the [ ] in the Comptroller's shop were transferred to OCS to raise the Office total [ ] physical consolidation occurred in March 1964 in Headquarters Building--the IBM 1401/1410/7090 equipment line being supplemented by [ ]

25X1 The [redacted] study (on-going in Mar 64) temporarily deferred organizational integration of the Comptroller's ADP group, hence a "shop-within-a-shop" structure existed until November 1964.

Early in 1965, after considerable study, the decision was made to convert to third-generation computer hardware, the ultimate model selected being the IBM 360/67. The OCS Computer Systems Planning Report was issued on 1 June 1965. From that date to the present, the evolutionary process has been going on through smaller 360 computers--the models 30, 50, and 65. The IBM 1400 and 7000 series Systems and the [redacted] Systems will be replaced early in CY 1968.

On 1 June 1966, Joe Becker left OCS, with Chuck Briggs of DDI/OCR coming in as Director.
