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by the Congress.

ADP

The Committee has annually expressed its concern regarding the system design difficulties and cost overruns which continue to occur in NFIP ADP development projects. The Committee, however, has seen relatively little improvement in overall management, and considering the fiasco which occurred this year in the joint DIA/CIA Support to Analysts File Environment (SAFE) system, is not convinced that the Intelligence Community understands the extent of the Committee's displeasure. The Committee is aware that directing the Community to "do better" is not necessarily conducive to producing better work. The Committee believes, however, that a system whereby the Community must periodically report to the Congress regarding the status of its major ADP system developments improves accountability for both management and resource expenditures.

The Committee directs, therefore, that it be provided by September 30, 1983 with a development plan for selected, major ADP systems which identifies the specific milestones which the project manager intends to achieve and which the Program Manager and the DCI are willing to endorse. These milestones should include:

- (a) Software development goals (by function, where applicable);
- (b) hardware acquisitions;
- (c) subsystem initial operating capabilities (IOC) with a definition of what constitutes each IOC; and

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(d) resource expenditures.

The DCI is requested to notify the Committee promptly of any significant change in any element of the plan.

Systems to be subject to this reporting requirement should include SAFE, the Integrated Automated Intelligence Processing System (IAIPS), the Consolidated Cryptologic Program Scoutmaster Project, and the National Photographic Intelligence Center system upgrade as a minimum.

The Committee believes that the Committee should reestablish a Community-wide group to oversee and coordinate ADP activities. This would help establish what common problems may be causing the proliferation of ADP systems suffering development difficulties.
