Welcome to Mr. Harry S. Traynor

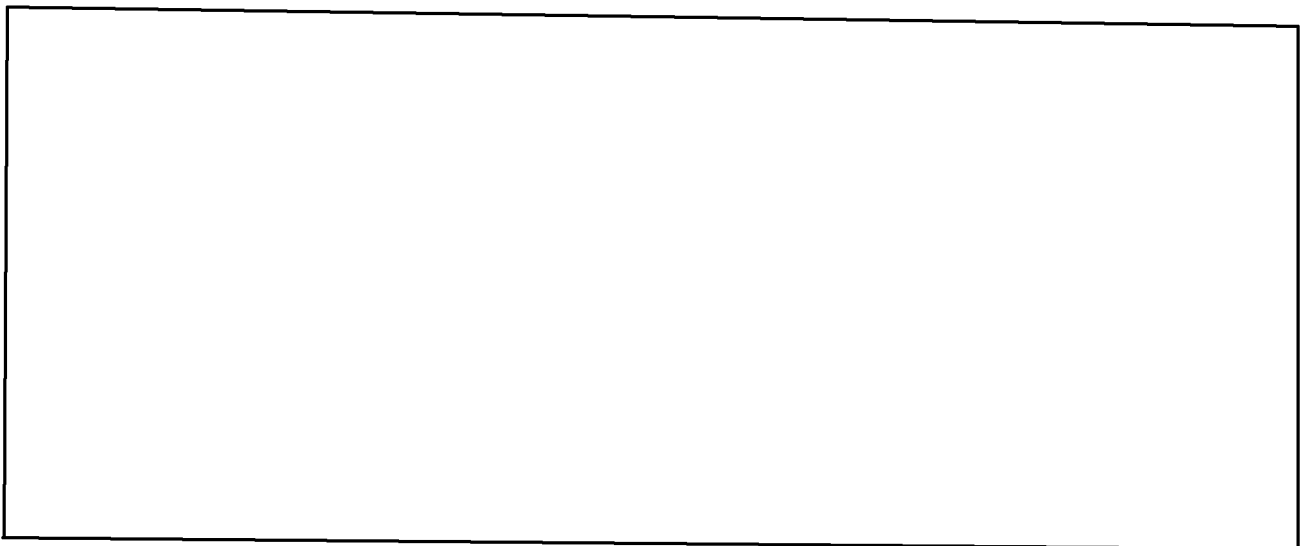
1. Mr. Dulles extended a cordial welcome to Mr. Harry S. Traynor, newly designated AEC representative to the IAC.

3. The minutes of the 3 August meeting were approved as written.



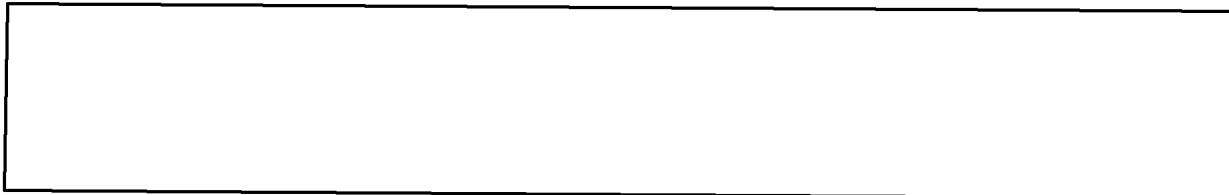

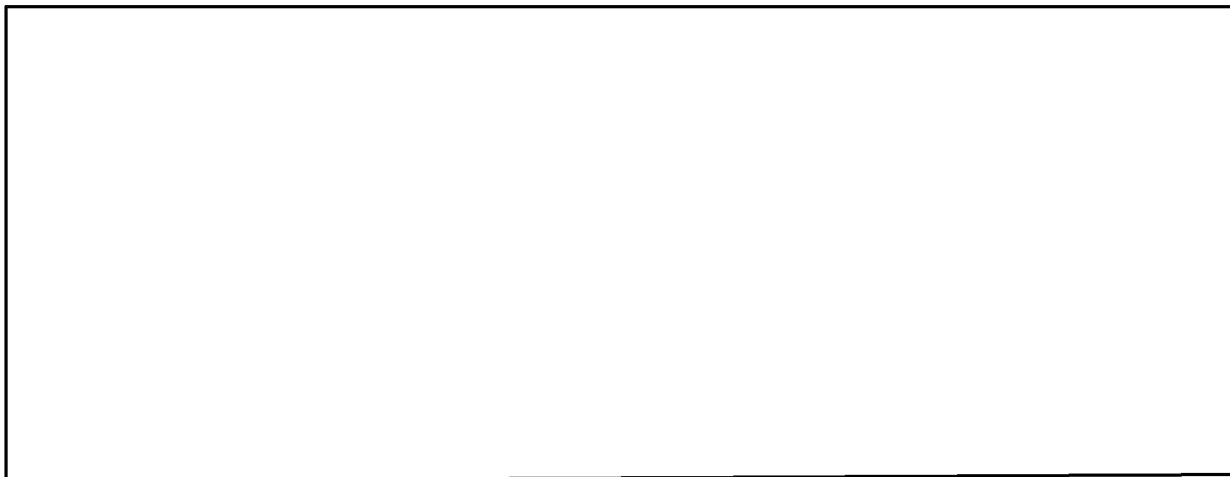

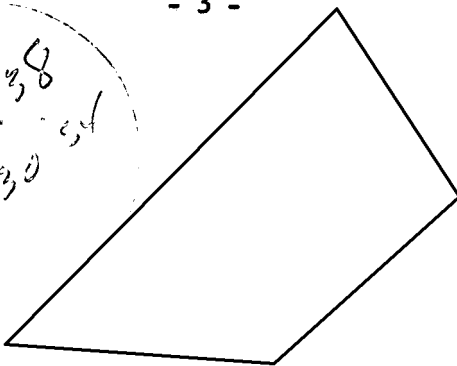
8. Mr. Dulles noted that the NSC had made certain changes to the suggested action on this subject as revised at the last IAC meeting. The JCS also circulated a paper to the NSC in line with the recommendations made at that time. The NSC added to paragraph 2 b. (See Annex to IAC-M-161) the word "significant" before the words "diplomatic, political, military, or other courses of action..." The phrase "in the judgment of those departments and agencies", suggested by the Defense agencies, was deleted. Paragraph 2 c was modified to read, in part as follows, "...the decision as to withholding or delaying the transmission of the information to the Watch Committee shall be taken up with the Director of Central Intelligence and, if there is disagreement, referred to the President."

Mr. Dulles also noted that the word "significant" had been added to paragraph 2 a to read "...all significant information and intelligence..." He indicated that this was apparently added subsequent to the meeting and he did not consider the change appropriate. This matter must still be worked out.

The NSC recommended that the President, subject to the DCI and the Director, FBI, agreeing upon editorial changes not affecting the substance, issue the directive to all appropriate departments and agencies (NSC Action 1195). Mr. Dulles stated that he would report further on the matter to the IAC.
