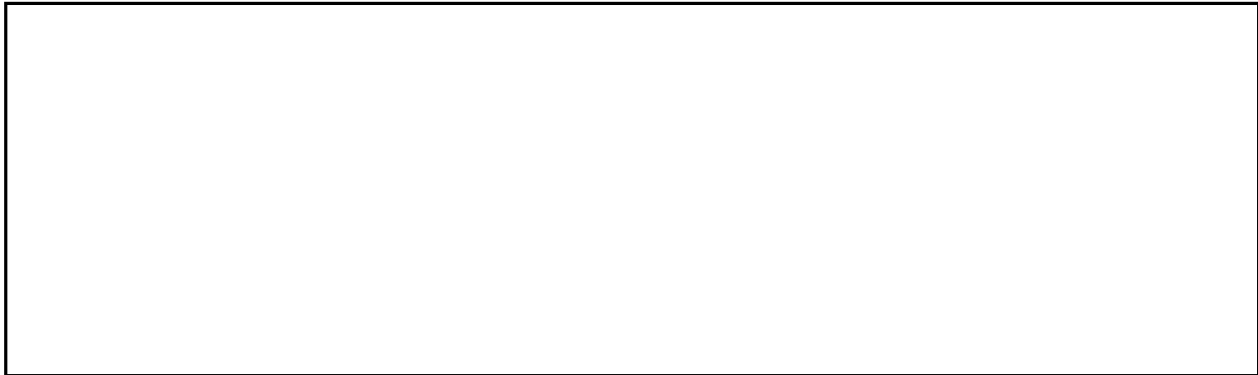

Approved the proposed DCID No. 1/2.

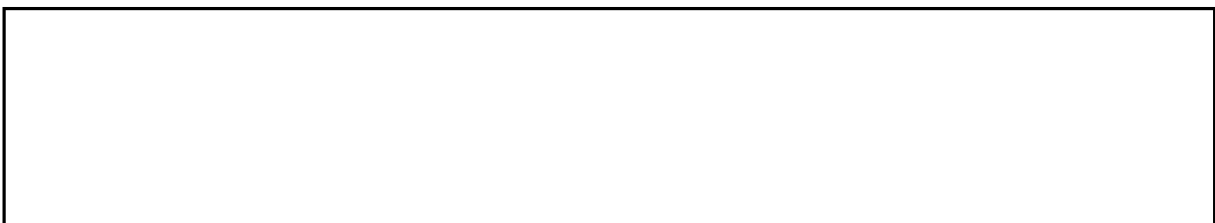

The Outlook for Ceylon

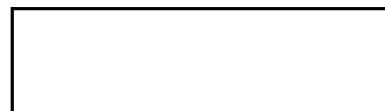
