2. Situation Review

a. Watch Committee Report  
No. 392

Noted.

b. The members discussed the French air attack on targets in Tunisia, late developments in Indonesia, Franco-Spanish military cooperation in Spanish Africa, and the possible union of Iraq and Jordan. As to the action in Tunisia, the members agreed with the Chairman that an estimate did not seem necessary at this juncture.

With regard to Indonesia, the Chairman asked that the recent speeches of Colonels Hussein and Simbolon, which contain the rebel demands, be reproduced and disseminated. In response to a question by the Chairman, Mr. Cumming expressed the opinion that military action by the Djakarta Government is less likely than an attempt to blockade the rebels into submission. He noted that the Department had looked into the question of obtaining a delay in delivery of aircraft on order in the US for Indonesia. General Schow commented on the military position of the rebels.

6. Report of IAC Ad Hoc Working Group  
(IAC-D-111/3, 5 February)

The members noted the report of the IAC Ad Hoc Working Group, and considered a CIA draft, which was tabled during the meeting, of a charter for an IAC subcommittee to be entitled the Critical Collection Problems Committee. The members approved the draft charter as amended, and agreed that it should be transmitted to the USCIB members, for consideration at the USCIB meeting of 14 February.

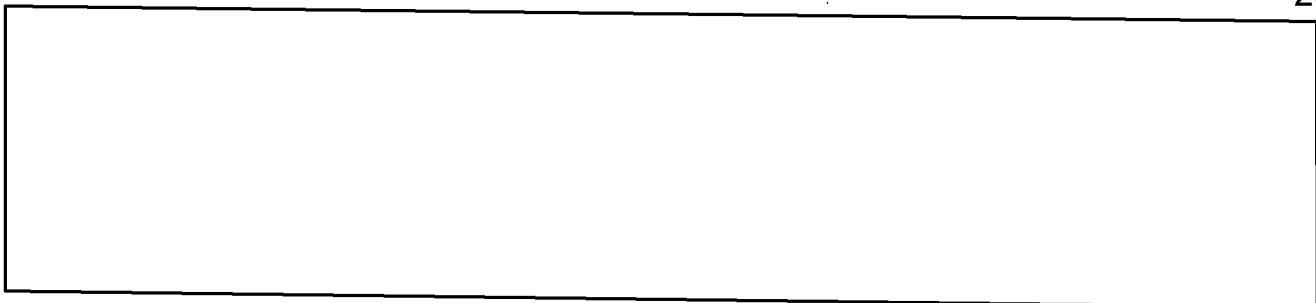

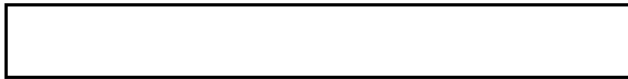

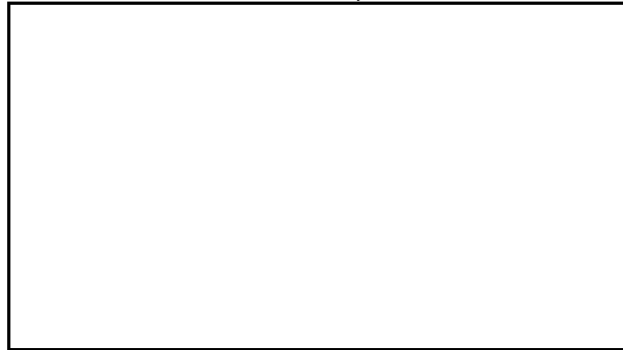
