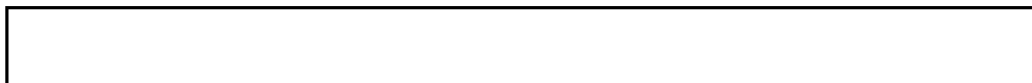

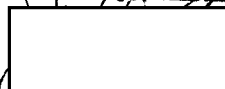
5. A Recommended U. S. Policy Toward Soviet and Soviet Orbit Official Representatives on Duty in the U. S. (IAC-D-2)
