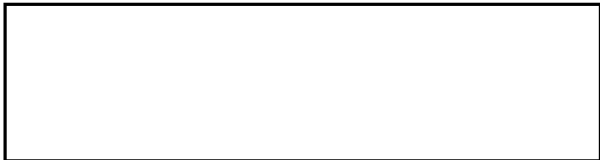

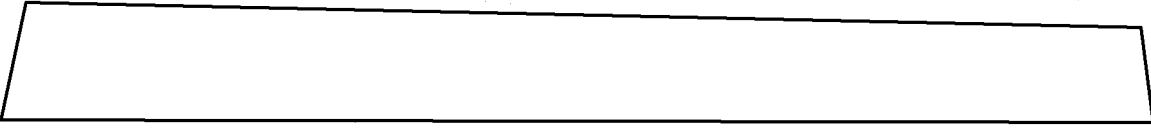

Distribution of NIS Studies to SHAPE

It is recognized that some of the NIS material cannot be made available to SHAPE's international staff. The question is whether the IAC should:

- a. Agree in principle to make NIS's available, recognizing that there will be exceptions and that CIA, with the advice of the NIS Committee, will review each section; or
- b. Ask the Army to obtain more detailed information concerning the need for particular chapters, the control procedures proposed,



Which alternative is chosen would depend largely on the views of the IAC members as to the sensitivity of the material in the chapters for which they are responsible.
